66th Annual General Meeting Indian Geotechnical Society 1900 hrs, Thursday, the 19th December 2024 Manthan Hall, MIT Aurangabad Maharasthra

ITEM 0 WELCOME BY THE PRESIDENT

Dr. Anil Joseph, IGS President, welcomed the members to 66th Annual General Meeting at the scheduled time. However, the meeting was adjourned due to non-presence of quorum and was reconvened after a break of 30 minutes.

Dr. Anil Joseph, President, IGS thanked IGS-Aurangabad Chapter for making all necessary arrangements for the meeting.

The meeting paid homage by observing a minute of silence for the eminent members of our association deceased during this year such as Prof. M.N. Viladkar, Dr. P.K. Jain, Dr. N.V. Nayak, Dr. V.V.S. Rao and Dr. J. Hari Krishna.

The President welcomed the Past Presidents of IGS, Members of existing and new Executive Committee and Members of IGS to 66th AGM. Subsequently, the agenda items were taken up for discussion.

ITEM 1 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES

The Minutes of 65th Annual General Meeting held on 14th December 2023 were circulated to the members as **Appendix-A** of the Agenda papers. No comments were received from the members. Prof. K.S. ITEM 2 AUDITED ACCOUNTS FOR 2022-2023

General Body using a Power Point Presentation by the Honorary Secretary, Dr. A.P. Singh. He briefed the General Body on different heads of Accounts. Prof. K.S. Rao proposed to adopt the accounts, which was seconded by Dr. Sanjay Verma. The General Body adopted the Audited Accounts for the year 2023-2024. Prof. K.S. Rao suggested that IGS should ask the IGS Local Chapters to encourage their student members to take membership of IGS Main Body.

ITEM 3 REPORT OF THE HONORARY SECRETARY

The Annual Report of the Honorary Secretary for the period between 15th December 2023 to 31st December 2024 was circulated to the members as **Appendix-C** of the Agenda papers. The same was presented by the Honorary Secretary, Dr. A.P. Singh, during the meeting using a Power Point presentation. The members appreciated and adopted the activity report with a loud applause.

ITEM 4 ADDRESS BY THE PRESIDENT

The address of the President was circulated to the members as **Appendix-D** of the Agenda papers. IGS President, Dr. Anil Joseph, presented the salient features of the address, particularly the achievements during the past two year. The AGM adopted the report with a loud applause.

Dr. Anil Joseph thanked all the IGS Task Committees members who have done good work during the past two years.

ITEM 5 REVISION IN MEMBERSHIP FEES

Dr. A.P. Singh, Honorary Secretary, IGS informed about the proposal of the Sub-Committee convened by Prof. G. Madhavi Latha. The matter had already been approved by the Executive Committee and the same was circulated to the members as Appendix of the Agenda papers. Members sought a few clarifications on the matter. After a brief deliberation, the AGM adopted the proposal of the Sub-Committee on Revision in Membership Fees. The revised Membership Subscription will be effective from 1st January 2025.

ITEM 6 PURCHASE OF NEW OFFICE SPACE

Dr. A.P. Singh, Honorary Secretary, IGS informed AGM about the purchase of new office space. The proposal was earlier approved by the Executive

Committee. He also informed AGM that buying Land for IGS Office is not feasible as the land prices are very high in Delhi. He proposed to buy bigger new office space viz.1500-2000 sq.ft, for IGS Office in Delhi & NCR. The General Body approved the proposal.

Also, AGM approved the following resolution:

"We propose to purchase new office space in Delhi/NCR in order to accommodate the growing needs of our Society. We have estimated that the cost of the new office premises will be around Rs.1.00 - 1.50 Crores for which we will utilize the capital fund received from the members in form of Life Membership Fees, Life Fellowship Fees, etc."

ITEM 7 TO REDUCE DURATION OF VOTING IN THE ELECTION

Dr. A.P. Singh, Honorary Secretary, IGS informed AGM about the following proposal to reduce duration of Voting in the IGS Election. The proposal was earlier approved by the Executive Committee. The item was deliberated at length by the members and approved the proposal to reduce duration of voting in the IGS Election to 15 days for future Elections.

ITEM 8 TO INCREASE NUMBER OF ASSOCIATE MEMBER IN EC COMPOSITION

Dr. A.P. Singh, Honorary Secretary, IGS informed AGM about the following proposal to modify the Election Process and increase number of Associate Member in EC Composition. The proposal was earlier approved by the Executive Committee. Notes forming part of the Financial Statements for the year ended, March 31, 2025

Note - 1 Brief about the School

The Indian Geotechnical Society (IGS) was established in 1948 with the primary objective of advancing and promoting the field of Geotechnical Engineering in India. Originally known as the "Indian National Society of Soil Mechanics and Foundation Engineering," its inception was driven by a group of engineers and scientists who recognized the need for a dedicated platform to address the evolving challenges and advancements in Geotechnical Engineering, following the second International Conference on Soil Mechanics and Foundation Engineering held in Rotterdam. In the same year, the Society attained affiliation with the International Society for Soil Mechanics and Geotechnical Engineering (ISSMGE) and subsequently adopted the name "Indian Geotechnical Society" (IGS) in December 1970.

Note - 2 Significant Accounting Policies

1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been drawn up under historical cost convention, following accrual basis of accounting and in accordance with applicable accounting standards and guidance note on financial statement of non-corporate entities (NPO) issued by The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

As per the criteria for classification of non-corporate entity as decided by The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, the school is not covered by conditions mentioned under Level II & Level III & Level III entities thus has been classified as Level IV entity for the current year

2 Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires the school to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of the annual financial statement, disclosure of contingent liabilities as at the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. The school believes that the estimates used in the preparation of annual financial statement are prudent and reasonable. Actual results could differ from these estimates. Difference between the actual results and the estimate are recognized in the period in which the results are known / materialized.

3 Property, Plant And Equipment

Property, Plant and Equipment are stated at cost of acquisition or construction less capital contribution towards fixed assets, if any less accumulated depreciation & impairment (if any). Costs directly attributable are capitalized until the property, plant and equipment are ready for use. Advance paid towards acquisition of property, plant and equipment and cost of property, plant and equipment not put to use on the balance sheet date are disclosed under capital work in progress.

Property, Plant and Equipment are valued at net of cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation on fixed assets is provided on Written-Down Value method, at the following rates:

4 Investment:

Long-term investments are valued at cost. They are suitably adjusted to recognize permanent diminution in value, if any.

5 Retirement Benefits:

For achievement of objectives of the school. The school is contribution to Provident Fund, Employees State Corporation during the year and same is recognized as an expense in the Income and its Application Account of the year in which the related services are rendered. Appropriate provision has been made for gratuity and leave encashment payable to staff members based on acturial valuation.

6 Revenue Recognition:

6.1 Contributions:

(i)Voluntary contribution (General): Voluntary contribution received by school, in cash or in kind is recognized as income when the voluntary contribution is received.

- (ii) Fee and other charges from students: Tuition fees and other charges from the students is recognized as income when the same is received and on accrual basis at the year end.
- (iii) Corpus contribution: Contribution received by school with in a specific direction that they shall form part of the corpus of the school are recognized as' corpus fund contribution'.

6.2 Other Income:

Interest income on saving bank accounts and fixed deposit receipts with banks have been accounted for on accrual basis. Surplus / Deficit if any, on disposal of fixed assets or other assets is recognized when the related assets are disposed off. Other miscellaneous receipts are accounted for on receipts basis.

7 Provision for taxes

The Institute is registered under Section 12AA of the Income Tax Act, 1961. In accordance with the provisions of the Act, the income of the Institute is exempt from tax, subject to compliance with the conditions prescribed therein. Consequently, no provision for income tax has been considered necessary in the accounts for the year ended March 31, 2025.





The main objectives and aim of the society are as follow: -

Note -1 Significant Accounting Policies

1. Basis of Preparation and Presentation of Financial Statements

2. Use of Estimates

3. Revenue Recognition

- Receipts are primarily derived in the form of grants / donations received from various donors which is recognized on receipt basis.
- (ii) Management have initiated to recognize income pertaining to refundable grants / donations to the extent of its utilization in respective year in Income and Expenditure account.
- (iii) Interest income out of any investments is included under the head 'Other Income' in the Income & Expenditure Account. Interest Income on deposits is recognised on a receipt basis based on the interest credited into bank account.
- (iv) Income and Expenditure are accounted on a receipt basis.

4. Contingent Liabilities

A contingent liability is a possible obligation that arises from past events whose existence will be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the entity or a present obligation that is not recognized because it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation.

- 2. The donations received in kind have not been reflected in the Financial Statements, however, expenses incurred thereon towards their acquisition have been accounted for.

REPORT BY THE PRESIDENT

Dear Distinguished Members,

Over the past year, IGS fraternity has once again demonstrated the power of collaboration and the limitless potential of geotechnical engineering, where science meets the earth and innovation reshapes the ground beneath us. The dedication of our members has propelled the Society forward, from frontier research breakthroughs to transformative field applications that are redefining engineering practice in India. I am deeply humbled by the unwavering support of my team, the National Executive Committee, whose collective spirit continues to fuel our mission. This year, the IGS local chapters demonstrated exceptional commitment and dynamism by organizing an impressive variety of technical seminars, workshops and conferences spanning numerous themes within geotechnical engineering. These initiatives not only enriched professional knowledge but also fostered stronger collaboration and engagement across the community.

A number of notable activities were carried out throughout this year. Among the major events were the expert lectures organized by the IGS Kochi Chapter, delivered by Prof. Ashish Juneja and Prof. Dasaka S. Murthy at the Kerala Management Association, Kochi, on 25th January 2025. This was followed by the 3rd Alam Singh Memorial Lecture, conducted by the IGS Jodhpur Chapter at MBM University on 30th January 2025. The IGS Goa Chapter, in association with the IEI Goa State Centre, organized a series of lectures at Goa Engineering College, Farmagudi, on 29th March 2025. These sessions paid tribute to the remarkable contributions of Dr. Victor De Mello and Dr. N. V. Nayak. The event included the seventh Victor De Mello Lecture by Prof. G. L. Sivakumar Babu and the inaugural Dr. N. V. Nayak Memorial Lecture by Prof. Deepankar Choudhury. On 29th April 2025, discussions with Dr. Ashok Kumar Gupta and Dr. Neerai Singh Parihar of the IGS Shimla Chapter focused on revitalizing chapter activities and expanding membership. On 22nd May, had a productive meeting with the Executive Committee of the IGS Indore Chapter. A visit to the IGS Thiruvananthapuram Chapter on 27th May offered valuable insights into preparations for Geotech Asia 2025 and the TSR Lecture Series. A One-Day National Workshop on "Geotechnical and Structural Engineering in Practice" was conducted by the IGS Baroda Chapter in collaboration with the Structural Engineers Association on 5th July 2025 at Grand Mercure, Surva Palace, Vadodara. Following the workshop, members of the IGS Executive Committee visited the Statue of Unity on 6th July 2025. The IGS Delhi Chapter, in association with IIT Delhi, held a one-day seminar on "Engineering Marvels: Chenab and Anji Bridge" on 15th July 2025 at RNI Park, IIT Delhi. The International Conference on Ground Improvement, Landfills and Sustainability (GLS-2025), hosted by the IGS Bengaluru Chapter jointly with the Department of Civil Engineering, IISc Bengaluru, took place at IISc from 18-19th July 2025. Furthermore, the 14th Annual Conference on Deep Foundation Technologies for Infrastructure Development in India was conducted on 8th September 2025 at Avadh Utopia, Surat, organized by the Deep Foundations Institute of India (DFI) in association with the IGS Surat Chapter. As part of the planning review for IGC 2025, a visit was made to NIT Jalandhar on 26th September 2025, and had the opportunity to interact with the office bearers of the IGS Jalandhar Chapter. A detailed meeting was also held with the IGC 2025 organizing committee and it is encouraging to observe that preparations are progressing with clear planning, strong teamwork and well-structured execution strategies. A Workshop on "Numerical Modelling for Geotechnical Engineering" held from 6th to 8th November 2025 at IIT Kanpur organized by IGS Kanpur chapter.

Various online activities were conducted during this year. On 3rd February 2025, the second lecture in the online series on "Conservation of Heritage Sites" was organized by Technical Committee TC 301 under ISSMGE. The lecture, titled "Potential Areas of Research and Development in Structural Conservation of Historical Structures," was delivered by Dr. Arun Menon, Professor, Structural Engineering Division, IIT Madras. To commemorate the Foundation Day of the IGS Bhubaneswar Chapter, an online lecture on "Climate-Resilient Analysis & Design of Embankments" was delivered by Prof. G. L. Sivakumar Babu of IISc Bengaluru on 9th July 2025.

The Asian Council Meeting was held online on 27th January 2025. A key highlight of the meeting was the voting for the inaugural ISSMGE Asian Lifetime Service Awards, which witnessed strong competition among seven shortlisted candidates. It is a matter of immense pride that Prof. M.R. Madhav was selected as one of the four distinguished recipients of this prestigious honour, alongside Prof. Kenji Ishihara (Japan), Prof. E.C. Shin (Korea) and Prof. Askar Zhussupbekov (Kazakhstan). On 28th February 2025, a meeting was held with Prof. Jean-Louis Briaud, former ISSMGE President, 2021 ASCE President and Professor at Texas A&M University. A technical talk was also delivered as part of the Geo-Institute Seminar Series at Texas A&M. Discussions were held with Prof. Marcelo Sanchez, Chair of the Technical Oversight Committee of ISSMGE and Prof. Zenon Medina, focusing on collaboration for the Pre-Conference Workshop on Machine Learning and Reliability in Geotechnics planned for the 1st Geotech Asia 2025 in Goa. The Indo-US Workshop, jointly supported by IGS, ASCE and the Geo-Institute (GI) was successfully held at the University of Louisville, Kentucky, USA, on 2nd March 2025 in conjunction with GeoFrontiers 2025. Sincere appreciation is extended to all speakers and participants from India for their valuable contributions. During the workshop, it was planned to conduct the next Indo-US Workshop during the 1st Geotech Asia 2025. I would like to specially acknowledge Prof. Sireesh Saride, Prof. Anand J. Puppala, Prof. Bhaskar Chittoori and Prof. Omid for their exceptional efforts. Attended the Geotechnical Frontiers 2025 Conference, held at the Kentucky International Convention Centre from 2-5th March 2025, which provided an excellent platform for interaction and representation. India had strong involvement at the event and there were engaging discussions with Ms. Helen Diane Robinson, President of the Geo-Institute, on strengthening Indo-US collaborations. Attended the 2nd International Conference on Civil Engineering - Innovative Development in Engineering Advances (ICC IDEA 2025) at SRM Institute of Science and Technology on 19th March 2025. Further, on 26th March 2025, an online address was delivered at the Sri Lankan Geotechnical Society (SLGS) Project Day, an annual platform supporting research and presentation skills development among civil engineering students in Sri Lanka.

Visited Kathmandu on 28th May 2025, which facilitated discussions with Dr. Mandip Subedi, President of NGS and other office bearers regarding preparations for the 1st Geotech Asia Conference. Deliberations also included future initiatives under AGSSA to promote regional collaboration in South Asia. A major highlight was the release of the publication "Geotechnical

Reconnaissance Report on Geo-Disasters in Nepal - 2024. During the 6th International Conference on GIS and Geoinformation Zoning for Disaster Mitigation (GIZ 2025), held during 28-30th August 2025 in Almaty, Kazakhstan, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was formalized between IGS and the Kazakhstan Geotechnical Society to support collaborative research and capacity-building. The presence of Prof. Keh Jian Shou (ISSMGE Vice-President Asia) and Prof. A. Boominathan reinforced the significance of this initiative. Under the HTC initiative of ISSMGE, Prof. Neelima Satyam successfully launched the HTC Champions Podcasts Asia 2025 Series, creating a meaningful platform featuring discussions with leading experts across academia and industry. Attended the 75th Anniversary Celebrations of the Brazilian Geotechnical Society (ABMS) in São Paulo, Brazil during 20-21st July 2025 representing IGS as Guest of Honour. The event provided a prestigious opportunity for international engagement. A keynote lecture was delivered during the event and participated in a round-table discussion on "Geotechnical Challenges for the Future" which was undertaken with representatives from ISSMGE, ITA, ISRM and other global organizations. The 1st Geotech Asia Conference and the associated Portugal-Brazil-India Pre-Conference Workshop were also presented to the international community.

The 1st Geotech Asia 2025, held at Taj Cidade de Goa, Horizon, concluded successfully and marked a major milestone for the Indian Geotechnical Society. The week-long programme commenced on 6th October 2025 with the FedIGS Board Meeting chaired by Prof. Chungsik Yoo, President of FedIGS. This was followed by four pre-conference workshops, namely the Portugal-Brazil-India workshop led by Prof. S. K. Prasad; the Indo-US workshop coordinated by Prof. Bhaskar Chittoori and Prof. Sireesh Saride; the Risk Assessment and Machine Learning workshop headed by Prof. Murali Krishna; and the Forensic Geotechnical Engineering workshop jointly led by Prof. Dasaka S. Murty and Prof. Prashanth Vangla. All four workshops received excellent participation and set strong benchmarks in technical knowledge sharing. The grand opening ceremony of the conference was inaugurated by Er. Digambar Kamat, PWD Minister and Former Chief Minister of Goa and was graced by distinguished dignitaries including Prof. T. G. Sitharam, Chairman of AICTE; the Presidents of the Brazilian and Portuguese Geotechnical Societies; and Prof. Anand Puppala, Vice President, Geo-Institute, USA. The conference thereafter unfolded into four full days of interactive learning supported by keynote addresses, panel discussions and technical sessions, with more than 650 participants from over 40 countries, positioning Goa as the global epicentre of international geotechnical exchange. A technical exhibition also ran parallel to the conference, adding further value to the deliberations. The Organizing Committee, under the leadership of Prof. Ashish Juneja and Prof. Dasaka S. Murty, played an excellent role in the smooth conduct of the event. Sincere appreciation is also extended to the IGS National Advisory and Executive Committees, the IGS Mumbai organizing committee, the IIT Bombay student volunteer team, IGS Goa chapter office bearers and the IGS Kochi team for their meticulous effort and coordination. The closing day of the conference included a special session of the Heritage Time Capsule and the Corporate Association Presidential Group, coordinated by Prof. Neelima Satyam. Another notable highlight of the conclusion of the conference was the ISSMGE Board Meeting convened by Dr. Marc Ballouz, President of ISSMGE, on 11th October 2025, which brought all international board members to Goa, marking a fitting finale to the event. During the Asian Council Meeting, it was announced that the Iranian Geotechnical Society will host the 2nd Geotech Asia in Tehran, Iran, in 2029, and the symbolic handing-over ceremony during the closing session reaffirmed the spirit of collaboration and continuity across Asia. The inaugural edition of Geotech Asia held in Goa holds historical significance for India. The country hosted the first Asian Regional Conference in 1960 and sixty-five years later, it again had the honour of launching a new platform for Asian collaboration in geotechnical engineering through Geotech Asia 2025. Building on this success, the focus ahead will be on strengthening membership and chapter growth, enhancing India's participation in international technical committees and collectively working toward the long-term aspiration of bringing the ICSMGE 2034 to India.

I am very much delighted to share that the Board of IACMAG has officially approved the list of Awardees for 2025, and Prof. M. R. Madhav has been selected to receive the Outstanding Contributions Medal, one of the highest international recognitions in the field of Computational and Analytical Methods in Geomechanics. This honour from IACMAG (International Association for Computer Methods and Advances in Geomechanics) is a testament to Prof. Madhav's lifelong contributions to geotechnical engineering, research excellence, academic leadership and his outstanding service to the profession globally. The award will be presented during the 17th IACMAG Conference in Hong Kong. We warmly congratulate Prof. Madhav for this richly deserved achievement and express our deep admiration for the inspiration he continues to provide to generations of researchers and practicing engineers.

The SC1 Committee, led by Prof. Murali Krishna, ensured the smooth functioning of the IGS website throughout the year with regular updates and timely communication support for activities across local chapters. The team efficiently handled bulk mailing and kept event information current, enabling better member engagement. A notable contribution was the systematic collection and compilation of technical resources for the IGS Virtual Library, significantly enriching the Society's shared knowledge base. Over the year, the Membership Development Committee made steady progress in strengthening both IGS and ISSMGE membership. The SC2 team, led by Prof. T. Thyagaraj, focused on increasing ISSMGE membership, while the SC3 team, under the leadership of Prof. Chandresh Solanki, developed targeted initiatives to expand IGS membership. Their combined efforts, including the consistent promotion of the professional benefits of association membership, contributed to a notable rise in new enrolments during the reporting period and their dedication to sustaining this growth is sincerely appreciated. The SC4 Committee on the IGS Foundation and Professional Forum, led by Dr. C. R. Parthasarathy has been actively collaborating with other professional organizations to conceptualize and deliver joint programs that support shared professional growth. Parallel efforts are also underway to raise funds through the IGS Foundation to promote skill-development and training initiatives and the committee's meticulous coordination in advancing these goals is sincerely appreciated. The SC5 Financial Committee, led by Er. Ravi Kiran Vaidya has responsibly managed the Society's finances within the approved budget while extending grants to local chapters to support their activities and their role in maintaining financial discipline and enabling chapter initiatives is sincerely appreciated.

During this year, the 56th local chapter of IGS was inaugurated at Lucknow, marking an important milestone in the Society's expansion. Under the leadership of Prof. Dasaka S. Murty and the SC8 team, initiatives to form additional chapters in Dehradun, Rewa, Anantapur, Madurai, Gorakhpur and Aligarh are progressing steadily, reflecting the growing interest of institutions and professionals across the country and strengthening the nationwide presence of

IGS. During this period, several new student chapters were formed and a number of student-focused activities were conducted across the country. I sincerely acknowledge the committed efforts of Prof. N. Unnikrishnan and the SC10 Committee for effectively coordinating and guiding these initiatives. It is requested to office bearers of the local chapters to register their student chapters with the headquarters and send reports to the headquarters on an annual basis following the standard operating procedure (SOP) of IGS Student chapters. We are happy to inform that the discussions are in progress to establish an award for the best student chapter of IGS. Meanwhile, the SC11 Committee, under the leadership of Prof. G. Madhavi Latha, is actively designing programs and activities aimed at fostering engagement and growth within the young geotechnical engineering community. The SC12 Committee, led by Prof. R. Ayothiraman, is putting lot of efforts to prepare the revised IGS Awards guidelines and I congratulate the team for the dedicated efforts.

Proud to inform that the Indian Geotechnical Journal (IGTJ) has been honoured with the "Growth Impact Award – 2025" by Springer Nature at the Springer Nature Annual Journal Development Symposium 2025, held at Le Meridien, New Delhi on 30th October 2025. This prestigious recognition has been awarded to IGTJ for its remarkable growth and increasing global impact in recent years. The award was received by Prof. Deepankar Choudhury, Editor-in-Chief of IGTJ and Dr. A. P. Singh, Hon. Secretary, IGS. Some of the impressive data shared by Springer Nature about IGTJ's recent growth leading to this award include a submission growth of around 150%, publication growth of about 180% while maintaining an acceptance rate of 25–30%, download growth of nearly 230% and revenue generation growth of about 150%, reflecting the consistent and balanced expansion of the journal's quality, reach and impact in recent years. Heartiest congratulations to Prof. Deepankar Choudhury and the entire Editorial Board of IGTJ for their exemplary leadership, dedication and teamwork that have brought this proud recognition to the Indian Geotechnical Society. This achievement highlights the growing international visibility and impact of Indian geotechnical research. Kudos to the entire IGTJ and IGS teams for this outstanding accomplishment!

The SC13 Committee, chaired by Prof. Anitha G. Pillai, ensured the regular publication of the IGS Newsletter throughout the year, delivering content of high relevance supported by strong editorial processes. Their efforts in upholding publication standards are duly acknowledged. The Society also recognizes the contributions of Dr. Jaykumar Shukla and the SC14 Committee, whose active participation in BIS-related engagements has been instrumental in the revision and enhancement of national geotechnical codes.
